# A Message from the Executive Director



Dear Friends of the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership,

Welcome to our 2018 Community Impact Report. We had a tremendous year in 2018. With your support, we have expanded the types of services we offer to the community. It was a pleasure to see the community engage these vital services.

Here are just three examples of enhanced services offered in 2018:

1. Understanding financial concepts is vital to self-sufficiency. We have launched financial empowerment workshops for low income community residents. The workshops include education on: goal setting, savings strategies, cash flow, dealing with debt and understanding credit and financial products. Workshops have been well received and attended. Packets are also available for each topic that can be delivered offsite in client homes or at worksites.
2. Being a new arrival in the US can be a difficult transition period. Our Job Center now provides specialized employment supports to refugees in Sacramento County. Services include: pre-employment workshops, job search support and individual case management. We have developed relationship with employers who hire from refugee and limited English populations. Our Job Center offers services in 14 languages. We continue to look for ways to support the job search and career goals of new arrivals.
3. There is immense pressure on young people to have a career path decided before they graduate from high school. One afternoon each week, FCCP staff provide job center services at Cordova and Kinney high school campuses to help students explore career pathways, develop resumes, learn job readiness skills, and obtain volunteer, internship or part time employment. The intent of this program is to help youth contextualize the importance of continued education through aligned career and education plans as well as help low income youth make ends meet.

We have had valuable opportunities to support the community in 2018. As we look toward 2019 and years to come, we rely on businesses and individuals like you to partner with us in making our impacts deep and meaningful. American child author Mattie Stepanek said, "Even though the future seems far away, it is actually beginning right now." I hope you will join FCCP in making 2019 even more incredible.

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## Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Overview

*94.6% of every dollar received by FCCP supports community programs.*

The total budget for FCCP during the fiscal year of 2017-2018 was \$1,820,924. Expenses that went directly to community programs were \$1,724,401. While providing these valuable services, we were able to strengthen our financial position by growing our assets by 6% from the previous year.

FCCP's financial statements are audited annually by an independent auditing firm.

*Highlights from 2018*



### Community Support Services



- Provided over 1,000 resources and referrals
- Provided 4,416 meals to families
- Distributed 8,460 diapers
- Assisted over 700 individuals with utility support to keep them connected.
- Upcycled 1,000s of pounds of clothing to families

### Effective Parenting



- 5,366 families attended activities at our Family Resource Center
- 958 children attended PlayCare services
- 370 adults participated in free Domestic Violence support services
- Provided 1,445 bus passes for medical appts.

### Employment Services



- 1,634 adults accessed the Job Center to look for a job
- 193 adults received one-on-one job coaching
- 62% of the people receiving individual job coaching retained jobs with an average wage of \$13.85 per hour
- 29 individuals received career training scholarships to learn new career skills

### Home Visitation



- 149 parents received home visitation services
- 95% of parents demonstrated significant improvements in skills
- Over 200 children received developmental screenings
- 88% of CPS referred parents had no additional CPS intervention after 1 year of services

### Youth Services



- 77 youth were connected to a positive adult mentor
- 31 young adults received intensive case management services in the Out of School Youth program
- 85% of disengaged young adults (18-24 yrs old) became employed and/or enrolled in education services

We bring together resources and programming in a Family Resource Center and Job Center to create a "one-stop shop" experience which encourages and supports families as they identify their own needs and reach their goals. We recognize that each family has strengths and encourage each family to build on these strengths to solve their own challenges.
